On March 12, 2015, I rendered a Decision with respect to the matter involving Constable Stephen Todd of the VPD. In my reasons, I was critical of the conduct of three police officers who interviewed and detained Constable Todd. The officers whose conduct I criticized were not members of the VPD. The sole involvement of the VPD officers related to making Constable Todd available to the three officers who were investigating his conduct. It was their duty to make Constable Todd available. They had no other dealings with Constable Todd. They took no part in either the interviews or the detention of Constable Todd.

I trust this Addendum clarifies any ambiguities that may have arisen from my original reasons.
