Who Decided a Public Hearing would be held?

Police Complaint Commissioner Prabhu Rajan issued a [Notice of Public Hearing](#) dated December 11, 2024, calling the public hearing under the *Police Act*. The Notice of Public Hearing summarizes relevant background information and sets out the Commissioner's basis for concluding that a public hearing is necessary in the public interest.

When Will the Public Hearing take place?

Adjudicator Elizabeth Arnold-Bailey, a retired judge of the BC Supreme Court, is presiding over the public hearing. She has set the public hearing to run four days per week, for ten consecutive weeks starting Monday, January 19, 2026. The schedule currently looks as follows (all weeks Monday to Thursday, except as otherwise noted):

- Jan 26-29
- Feb 2-5
- Feb 9-12
- Feb 17-20 (Tuesday to Friday)
- Feb 23-27
- Mar 2-5
- Mar 9-12
- Mar 16-19
- Mar 23-26

Where Will the Public Hearing take place?

The public hearing will take place in Room C440 at UBC Robson Square which is located at 800 Robson Street in downtown Vancouver. It will start at 9:30 a.m. on each day, unless otherwise directed by the Adjudicator.

The public hearing is open to the public. There will be limited seating in the hearing room. Seats will generally be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Will the public hearing be streamed?

The public hearing will be streamed online (audio only located [here](#)). Those who want to listen to the audio feed will be able to do so from their computers or devices using an internet link. Clicking the link will take the listener to an online room where they will be able to hear the audio feed, but will not be able to interact with or see others who may also be listening. If you want access to an exhibit, please send an email to staylor@opcc.bc.ca, identifying yourself and stating that you want to access one or more exhibits. Staff of the Office of the Police Complaint Commissioner will then be able to send you log-in information that you can use to access an on-line portal where exhibits that the Adjudicator has approved for release will be stored.

Please note that access may not be instant. As staff will be focused during the hearing days on the efficient and orderly progress of the public hearing, there may be time lags in uploading approved exhibits, and/or responding to requests for access.
