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MYLES GRAY PUBLIC HEARING SET TO RESUME

Victoria – The Office of the Police Complaint Commissioner (OPCC) public hearing into allegations of police misconduct relating to the death of Myles Gray will resume on Monday, September 28, 2026, and continue over the coming months.

The following public hearing dates will take place at 9:30 a.m. at the University of British Columbia (UBC) Robson Square, located at 800 Robson Street in downtown Vancouver.

- September 28-29 (Room C440)
- October 1 (Room C440)
- October 13-16 (Room C575)
- November 16-19 (Room C575)
- November 30-Dec 2 (Room C575)
- December 16 + 18 (Room C440)

Additional dates may be held *in camera* (a private hearing) to deal with applications from certain respondent members seeking to have their prior testimony from a Coroner's inquest used at the public hearing for medical reasons.

The hearing schedule is always subject to change. Any necessary updates will be posted to the [Public Hearings page](#) of the OPCC website.

There will be limited seating in the hearing room and seats will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. The hearing will also be audio streamed online, and a link to access the live stream will be available on the [OPCC website](#).

The Adjudicator, the Honourable Elizabeth Arnold-Bailey, has made an [Order on Access and Recording](#) in this case that, among other things, prohibits the audio or video recording of the proceeding, subject to certain limited exceptions for the media who may make audio recordings for the sole purpose of verifying their notes.

While the public hearing is underway, the OPCC will not provide comments about the merits of the case other than through its counsel at the public hearing.

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About the OPCC and Public Hearings:

- The Police Complaint Commissioner is a civilian, independent Officer of the Legislature overseeing complaints, investigations and discipline involving municipal police in British Columbia.
- While the OPCC does not have a mandate to investigate or make determinations about police misconduct, it does act in the public interest to ensure allegations are fully investigated and fairly decided.
- A public hearing is called when the Commissioner determines it is necessary and in the public interest. This hearing is not limited to the evidence and issues canvassed at the discipline proceeding.
- A retired judge is appointed to sit as the Adjudicator and review the evidence, hear sworn testimony, and arrive at a decision as to whether there is misconduct and, if necessary, determine the corrective and/or disciplinary measures to be imposed. The retired judge may also recommend changes in policy or practice.

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
